Our Business and Ethics

Our Approach

Quorum Cyber has never been convicted or offenses relating to modern slavery. We take the following specific steps to ensure that we do not allow modern slavery to occur within our business:

- We review all employment contracts to ensure that they do not include coercive terms.
- We pay our employees at least the national minimum wage applicable within their country of operations

Starting from 2021, we include a review of statements on Modern Slavery as part of our annual review of third-party suppliers, to ensure that we do not have instances of modern slavery in our supply chain.

Quorum Cyber will terminate any contract in place at any time should instances of modern slavery come to light.
